It is important that students not only understand the events of the past, but the significance of how those events affect their own lives. 
Before students begin the Veritas Press history courses, however, it is crucial for them to be able to answer the question, "What is history?" This is why the *Bede* books were created. *Bede's History of ME* is a primer, laying the groundwork for their later years of study. Upon completion of this workbook, students will better understand timelines, geography, their own history, the history of the church, and much more.

The instructor should read the book to the student from the perspective of Bede, the yarn ball. Students should simply follow the instructions you give as you read the book aloud to them. Some projects will require assistance from the instructor. Take your time and make this enjoyable. *Bede's History of ME* is designed to fill a school year by being used only once a week. As this is meant to be an exploratory introduction to history, we do not recommend grading the student's work.

Look ahead in the book to gather materials for upcoming projects. Craft or other project pages that need to be cut out are located at the back of the book, and the projects will refer you to those pages as necessary.

It has been said that what we learn from history is that we do not actually learn from history. We recognize that you do not wish this to happen in the lives of your students. That is why Veritas Press strives to equip you to impart not only the facts about history but its lessons as well. The *Bede* workbooks will help you establish a foundation on which these lessons can be built.

TIMELINE 1

To learn how a timeline works, do the following activity.

- 1. Stretch a long piece of yarn across the floor.
- 2. Put a penny on the beginning of the piece of yarn, a second penny at the end of the piece of yarn, and several more pennies evenly spaced every few feet along the piece of yarn.
- 3. On a piece of paper or on a chalk board draw a long line with dots on it like the pennies on the yarn.



- 4. Stand at the penny at one end of the yarn. Do something there (see the examples below) then hop to the next penny and do something different. Keep doing this until you reach the last penny.
- 5. Write down what you did at each penny.


It may end up looking something like this:



In the example above, sitting was done first and snapping was done last. Clapping happened before spinning and blinking was done later than hopping.


TIMELINE 2

Draw pictures in the boxes on the timeline below that illustrate what you did today, in the order that you did it. The first box should be a picture of you waking up in your bed.




PAST/PRESENT



FAMILY TIMELINE


Make a timeline of your family.
