



The disciples brought the young donkey, and put some of their clothes on its back. Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Crowds of people joined the procession.






Some cut down branches from the palm trees and placed them on the ground in front of Jesus. Others laid down their cloaks.

Jesus rode right into the town.







Jesus was sent then to Pilate the Roman Governor.


'Are you the King of the Jews?' Pilate asked.





Herod and the soldiers cruelly mocked him and dressed him up in a purple robe, and then sent him back to Pilate.

Jesus promised, 'Today you will be with me in Paradise.'


In the final moments of his life, the thief asked Jesus for mercy. Jesus showed him love by forgiving his sin.

He disappeared from their sight. They then understood all that had been said on the road.


They rushed back to Jerusalem to tell the disciples. 'The Lord really has risen,' they said.





'No!' they replied.


'Put your net down again,' he said. When they did that, they caught a huge number of fish.
